







"What is Maundy Thursday?"

Maundy Thursday, also known as "Holy Thursday," is the Thursday of Passion Week, one day before Good Friday (the Friday before Easter). Maundy Thursday is the name given to the day on which Jesus celebrated the Passover with His disciples, known as the Last Supper. Two important events are the focus of Maundy Thursday. First, Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with His disciples and thereby instituted the Lord's Supper, also called Communion and second Jesus washed the disciples' feet as an act of humility and service, thereby setting an example that we should love and serve one another in humility. The word Maundy is derived from the Latin word for "command." The "Maundy" in "Maundy Thursday" refers to the command Jesus gave to the disciples at the Last Supper, that they should love and serve one another.



Holy Week Reading -

The week prior to Easter is known as Holy Week, starting with Palm Sunday. During the week I would like to invite you to read from the Scriptures of the events that happen that week. I put together an assortment of passages in the order that I imagine that they may have happen. I hope you find it meaningful to you.

Start Palm Sunday, April 5th thru Wednesday, April 8th reading **Matthew 21** thru **Matthew 26:16.**

Thursday, April 9th read **Matthew 26:17-68.** (John 13 - John 17:26 is more Info if you want to know more.

Friday, April 10th, read **Matthew 27:1-10; Isaiah 50:6; Isaiah 52:14; Isaiah 53:2-12; Psalm 22:14-18; Luke 22: 54-65; Mark 15:1-20; Matthew 27:27-31; John 19:1-16; Luke 23: 26-43; Matthew 27:45-56;**

John 19:28-30; Luke 23:44-49; John 19:31-42.
