
1. What verse number spoke to me? 2. What did that scripture say to me? 3. If I can apply what I got from the scripture, how could it change me?

News and Updates

So far, 2020 has brought the unexpected and the unusual, dictating that we cancel and change our plans and routines. While it's tempting to fret about the negatives as we do our parts to slow the Covid-19 Pandemic, we have more time to reflect on the positives, count our many blessings, and view this as an opportunity to spend more quality time with our families, to plan and prepare more nutritious foods, to clean out and reorganize those drawers and closets, to read and study.

This year's circumstances have dictated that the United Methodist Women's organization (UMW) also change, postpone, and cancel some of its plans. There have been only four meetings so far this year, and no meeting for August. April's UMW Recognition Day was canceled, along with its traditional announcement of this year's Special Mission Recognition recipients. July's annual salad day was canceled.

On the positive side, UMW has been blessed to continue supporting several of its projects, such as an annual summer scholarship for a student at NACC and copies of the *Upper Room* for the congregation, as well as mission support to the Pastor's Outreach Fund, the Upper Sand Mountain Parish, the local Boys & Girls Club, Turning Point Pregnancy Center, the United Methodist Children's Home, Jackson County Children's Advocacy Center, and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

In an effort to adapt to the present circumstances and change a negative to a positive, UMW is pleased to announce this year's Special Mission Recognition recipients: **Jean Abel** and **Robert Shook**. Each will receive a special UMW pin.

Jean Abel is always willing to do any task asked of her and, if not asked, simply volunteers. Her beautiful voice in the choir and her ready smile bring joy to all. Jean volunteers for local non-profit organizations, such as the Jackson County Council on Aging and the Jackson County Children's Advocacy Center. Jean's mission work continues through UMW. Randall's Chapel and all who know this fine Christian woman are very blessed.

Robert Shook exhibits exemplary mission service at Randall's Chapel and in the community, especially as a volunteer with the Jackson County Rescue Squad. One recent example is Shook's response on a cold January morning this year during a devastating and deadly boat dock fire at the Jackson County Park. Shook and a friend risked their lives to rescue seven people from the icy waters of the Tennessee River. Shook was one of three presented awards by the Scottsboro City Council, Police Department, and Fire Department for going "above and beyond the call of duty" that morning.

We will not have the following for a while: No physical Greeting time. No Communion. No Children's Message. No coffee or snacks. No Sunday School classes. No Nursery. No water fountains. No passing of the offering plates/ baskets; they will be stationed and you may put your offering in the plate/basket.


Annual Conference of the North Alabama United Methodist Church -

The Conference has again been rescheduled for Saturday, September 26th. This event will be done through live internet sources only. More info will be provided later.






