

Overcomer

For whatever is born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith. – 1 John 5:4

Stop me if you have heard this one before..."Life Is Hard." Let's face it, we all have something that seems so difficult to handle. During the months of July and August we are exploring Experiencing Victory in our lives on Sunday mornings. And over what are we seeking victory...this hard life. The question for many of us is, what is it that is so hard?



Things with which we struggle that are not going to be exactly the same as those around us. Your struggle may be physical, emotional, relational, or spiritual. What may seem small to someone else could be unbelievably huge for you. Yet, whatever the struggle, whatever the pain, or temptation, we have one thing in common; we all desire to overcome that struggle. We desire to be overcomers.

In Revelation 2-3 Jesus pointed out gatherings of God's people who struggled with one thing or another, yet in every case one theme kept being repeated..."to him who overcomes." God knows and sees what it is that we face in our lives, and He declares, "to those who overcome." Do you hurt; you can be an overcomer. Do you doubt or live in fear; you can be an overcomer. Do you wrestle with your own personal sin; you can be an overcomer. God calls us to live victorious in our lives, to be overcomers.

## **History of August**

In the ancient Roman calendar, August was initially called *mens sextilius*, **the sixth month**, because the Roman calendar started in March. Sextilis had 31 days. Around the year 700 BCE, the Roman king Numa Pompilius expanded the calendar from ten to twelve months by introducing January and February. Sextilis was reduced to 29 days.

In 154 BCE, a rebellion forced the Roman senate to change the beginning of the civil year from March to January 1st. With this reform, Sextilis officially became **the eighth month**.

In the year 46 BCE, **Julius Caesar** introduced a new calendar system—the Julian calendar. He added ten days to the year and introduced the leap day. In the new Julian calendar, Sextilis was expanded to 31 days.

In the year 8 BCE, the Roman senate then renamed Sextilis to honor the first Roman emperor, **Augustus Caesar**. Augustus was not the emperor's name but his title. It means "the great" or "the venerable." The Roman senate gave this title to the emperor Gaius Caesar Octavius in the year 27 BCE because of his military and political victories that founded the Roman empire.

# **August Birthstone and Birth Flower**

According to tradition, the birthstones for August are **peridot** and **onyx**. Its birth flower is the gladiolus or poppy, representing beauty, strength, love, marriage, and family.




