Guests simply come prepared to make their donations and pick up their lunches to go.

If you do Facebook, whenever you see the Salad Day notice on the church website or Facebook page, please repost or share it with your Facebook friends. If you don't do Facebook, please call or text your friends and acquaintances and tell them, and then remind them. Above all, please stop by to pick up boxed lunches or ask someone in your workplace to take orders and pick up lunches. A donation of \$8.00 per boxed lunch is appreciated.

To facilitate the process, tables will be set up in the hallway inside the entrance of the new building wing. To streamline the flow of foot traffic in the area, one door will be marked ENTER, and the other door will be marked EXIT.



# "Change for Missions"


