

Stand Fast

Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free, and do not be entangled again with a yoke of bondage.

Galatians 5:1

It is July. The time of the year where we wave flags, sing patriotic songs, look at fireworks and declare how excited we are for the freedoms we have been given. Many of us will tell our children about the privileges that come from growing up in this great nation. We will speak of the ones who laid it all on the line so that we can have these freedoms and opportunities. And we will tell our children to stand fast as they live into that freedom.



Sometimes that liberty is threatened. By war, by politics, by bad choices that we may have made, and even by circumstances outside of our control. We can see our nation torn apart by debates over life and personal choice. We can hear as our national leaders spew divisive hate and rhetoric that we would never accept from our children. And in the midst of these challenges to the American dream and the life of liberty we will choose to stand fast for our freedom.

The Apostle Paul, within this passage, reminds us that the children of God have a special kind of liberty, bought and paid for by Jesus. In this verse he reminds us that Christ paid for our liberty from sin, fear, death and whatever this world may throw at us, and that we do not need to live in the bondage of slavery ever again. No longer slaves to our sin. No longer slaves to our fears. We stand fast, free in Christ.

But I believe at the heart of this verse is the very first word(s) of the verse. "Stand fast" is taken from the Greek word that means to persevere. To be able to stand stationary in an ever-changing world. To remain strong when the world crumbles around us. To endure when it seems we cannot endure one more trial. And in what do we stand fast; in what do we persevere? Liberty. Freedom from sin. Freedom from the need to ever go back into the dark places from which we have been redeemed. Jesus said that "if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed" (John 8:36). So, friends, let us remember freedom, bought and paid for, and let us stand fast.

United Methodist Women's Salad Day 2022 – To-Go Boxed Lunches

SAVE THE DATE. On Tuesday, July 26 th , from 11:00 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. (or until all 200 boxes are taken) the UMW plans to offer ready-to-go boxed lunches again this year. Each box will contain chicken salad on greens, pasta salad, and strawberry pretzel salad, as well as disposable flatware, napkin, and saltines for a donation of \$10 per box.

All donations are used to help support organizations such as the Jackson County Children's Advocacy Center, Nourish One Child Backpack Food Program, Turning Point Pregnancy Center, Ben Sanford Boys & Girls Club, Upper Sand Mountain Parish for back-to-school supplies, and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. In addition, UMW awards a summer scholarship for a student at Northeast Alabama Community College, provides copies of The Upper Room daily devotionals to members of the congregation, donates to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund to help the needy, and adopts two foster children in the annual Christmas Angels Program. UMW members strive to practice good stewardship with all donations entrusted to them. Randall's Chapel UMW appreciates the many ways that you have supported the organization throughout the years. Without your loving support, the mission outreach of UMW could not have happened.

Because the boxes were so popular last year, 144 boxes were ordered and picked up before 12:30, unfortunately leaving a few disappointed folks. As a result, we are trying to do better this year by preparing more boxes and allowing members of the congregation first chance to reserve boxes ahead of time. If you want to reserve boxes before July 26, simply sign up on a form available in the hallway by providing the following information: your name and phone number, the number of boxes you need, and the time you will pick up your order. When you arrive, you will be greeted by a member of UMW, and your order will be ready and brought to you.

To facilitate the pick-up process, tables will be set up in the hallway inside the entrance of the new building wing. To streamline the flow of foot traffic in the area, one door will be marked ENTER, and the other door will be marked EXIT.







