Lord, after the children are grown and in school, then I will give you my life and trust you. Lord, after I pay all my bills, then I will give you a little something. I know of a widow who wasn't a Then person, but a Now person.

'Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a fraction of a penny.

Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything – all she had to live on." Mark 12:41-44 NIV

I believe this woman gave in faith to the Lord her God, believing He would meet her needs and showed it Now. What is it that we keep putting off until later by saying, 'Then, I'll get to it.' Is it trusting Jesus to be our Lord and Savior? Is it tithing? Is it serving as a volunteer? Is it commitment to regular church attendance? If you are waiting until later to trust God, you're going to miss out on a lot.







We hosted 57 guests last year over the 4 months of December - March. Many of you volunteered your time to make this a blessing for our guest. Thank you!

In order to partake and be a host church we are in need of a volunteer(s) to be our church coordinator, someone who will oversee and plan all that needs to be done. We probably will need to host our homeless guest twice each month, December thru March.


The responsibilities will include coordinating volunteers in these areas:

1. Attend Room In the Inn meetings to schedule nights when we could host guest.
2. Coordinator welcomes our guest and discuss church rules with them.
3. Coordinate volunteers to prepare and serve supper and breakfast for our guest when they stay with us.
4. Coordinate volunteers to drive two vans in the evening and morning to transport our guests.
5. Coordinate volunteers to spend the night with our guest. At least one male and one female.
6. Coordinate all the preparation for getting sheets, pillowcases, washcloths, towels and blankets ready for guest. Prep rooms for our guest.
7. Coordinate volunteers to wash all the sheets, pillowcases, towels and blankets.
8. Coordinate volunteers to clean up after guest have left in the mornings.
9. Coordinator checks information from registration coordinator the nights we host.







Top Ten Historical Thanksgiving Facts

1. Thanksgiving Day is celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November in the USA.
2. Thanksgiving Day is celebrated on the second Monday in October in Canada.
3. The Plymouth Pilgrims were the first to celebrate the Thanksgiving.
4. They celebrated the first Thanksgiving Day in the fall of 1621.
5. The Wampanoag Indians were the people who taught the Pilgrims how to cultivate the land.
6. The Pilgrim leader, Governor William Bradford, had organized the first Thanksgiving feast in the year 1621 and invited the neighboring Wampanoag Indians also to the feast.
7. The state of New York officially made Thanksgiving Day an annual custom in 1817.
8. The annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade tradition began in the 1920's.
9. Californians are the largest consumers of turkey in the USA. By the fall of 1621 only half of the pilgrims, who had sailed on the Mayflower, survived. The survivors, thankful to be alive, decided to hold a thanksgiving feast.
