If at first you don't succeed . . .

Back in August I had the opportunity to help a lady and her children get establish in a home through your financial support from our Pastor's Discretionary Fund. Thanks for your support! I also learned from her there were nights her children and her found comfort and shelter through the local support of Room In the Inn ministry.

Last year several of you signed up to volunteer your support to help our church be a host church in this ministry; unfortunately, we did not have enough volunteers in all the areas that would have made this possible. So after getting more information about Room In the Inn ministries, I would like to try again, to see if we can succeed. Some information about Room In the Inn . . .

Room In the Inn is a Scottsboro ministry opportunity to help the homeless during the nights of the winter months of Dec. thru Feb. All guests register at Calvary Baptist Church and have a criminal check run on them.

We would then pick up our guest at 6:00 p.m. and drive them to our church for the night. At our church, a hot meal would be served. Time of fellowship with the guest occurs for a while and then the men and women will be separated to their lodging rooms. Room In the Inn supplies the host church with thin mattresses, sheets and blankets for the guest.

In the morning the guest will be fed a breakfast and given a sack lunch. Then the guest will be driven back to Calvary Baptist Church by 7 a.m.

Volunteers are needed in several areas:

- To drive the church van to bring guest to and from our church.
- To drive the Room In the Inn van with the mattresses to the church.
- To prepare a simple hot meal for supper.
- To prepare a simple breakfast meal.
- To prepare sack lunches.
- To spend the night at the church with our guest. (Male & Female)
- To wash sheets following the guest stay.

The Room In the Inn desires that a host church can host at least twice a month, but will be grateful for any opportunities a church can host or serve.

Sign-up sheets will be available in the near future and you can contact the office to sign up. As before, having enough volunteers is the only way to make this a success. Please be in prayer about being a part of this ministry opportunity from Randall's Chapel.

Christmas Cantata



How do leaves change color?



As the Earth makes its 365-day journey around the sun, some parts of the planet will get fewer hours of sunlight at certain times of the year. In those regions, the days become shorter and the nights get longer. The temperature slowly drops. Autumn comes, and then winter. Trees respond to the decreasing amount of sunlight by producing less and less chlorophyll. Eventually, a tree stops producing chlorophyll. When that happens, the carotenoid already in the leaves can finally show through. The leaves become a bright rainbow of glowing yellows, brilliant reds, sparkling oranges and warm browns.


